Climbing Rose Classifications

- **Cl F-Climbing Floribunda:** Clusters of medium sized flowers
- **L Cl-Large-Flowered Climber:** Distinctively large flowers
- **Cl HT-Climbing Hybrid Tea:** Large flowers borne on single stems
- **Cl S-Shrub:** Free blooming with long arching canes
- **Cl Pol-Climbing Polyantha:** Large airy clusters of blossoms
- **Cl Min-Climbing Miniature:** Small flowered climber with proportionately smaller foliage.

Most climbing roses will reach 10—14 feet.

Climbing Rose Pruning Tip:

Climbing roses often bloom on both old and new wood. Prune only to shape, control growth, or remove dead or damaged canes.

We recommend planting your new roses with:

Rose Planting Mix, Master Start Fertilizer, Mykos mycorrhizal inoculant, and Root Master B-1. Once planted spray with **Neem Oil** every 2 weeks in June, July, & August.

Miniature Roses

<i>Rainbow's End</i>	<i>yellow/orange</i>
<i>Sunblaze Rainbow</i>	<i>yellow orange red</i>

Miniature: Small flowered roses with proportionately smaller foliage, often very compact in habit. Stems are also shorter but still suitable for cutting.

Flower Carpet Roses

Bred for improved disease resistance, prolific blooming, cold hardiness & compactness as a low maintenance groundcover. Flower Carpet Roses are moderate to fast growing to 3ft high and wide.


Colors: **Amber, Coral, White, Red, Scarlet, Yellow, Pink, Pink Splash and Pink Supreme.**

Rose Classifications

F-Floribunda: Medium sized flowers mostly borne in clusters, more compact in habit, medium length stems.

Gr-Grandiflora: Large flowers borne in clusters, taller in habit, individual stems are suitable for cutting.

R -Hybrid Rugosa: Exceptionally hardy, vigorous, usually upright compact plants. Most are recurrent bloomers.

HT-Hybrid Tea: Large flowers generally borne one per stem, medium to tall in habit, long cutting stems.

Poly-Polyantha: Small flowers borne in very large clusters, compact in habit, with medium-short stems.

S-Shrub: Free blooming plants broadly varying in size and form, usually good disease resistance & hardiness. Most are grown on their own root.

E/DA English: Repeat bloomer with form and fragrance of old garden roses from David Austin.

GC-Groundcover: Low mounding habit with continuous bloom. Excellent for slopes & low accents.

Rose Growing Tips

- **Mulch** your roses enough to cover the bud graft for winter protection.
- Remember to **water** your roses, and all other plants, through the winter if we get less than an inch of moisture during the month.
- When **pruning**, if the cane is 1/8 inch and larger, seal it.
- Stop **deadheading** your roses the 1st of September.
- Prune roses coming out of winter **April 15th**. Take only 30% of the shrub at any one time. Fertilize at the same time and pull the mulch away from the graft. Deadhead throughout the summer for continual bloom.
- **Fertilize** roses through the growing season. Heavy bloomers are heavy feeders.
- Spray **dormant oil** to suffocate overwintering insect eggs late winter or early spring.
- While roses can be grown in most sites, too much afternoon shade can allow mildew to occur. Being **too wet** can also cause numerous problems.

David's rose selection tip:

Most gardeners have the easiest to-care-for roses when they plant Shrubs, Groundcovers, Hybrid Rugosas and Miniatures.

Hybrid Teas, English, and Grandifloras need the most care and protection while the Floribunda, Climbing, and Polyanthas fall in the part-time attention group.
